Lizby Eustis - she is a real estate agent and supporter of Habitat. She spoke against moratorium.

Jeff St. Romain - he is the CEO of Habitat. He spoke against moratorium.

Terry Stevens - she spoke for the moratorium.

Cleosia Seay - she is a new board member with Habitat. She spoke against moratorium.

Bellisario - he would like to postpone this for 1 month. He served on the United way ALICE Project (Asset Limited, Income Constrained, Employed), which represents the employed poor, such as healthcare workers, cashiers, daycare workers, who live paycheck to paycheck. We need to further define the areas which will be included in this moratorium. He wants to make sure that Habitat and NHI can continue to build affordable housing.

Council discussion ensued.

Patricia Brister - the sales tax rate in the Parish is 9.75% and the Parish only receives 2% of that. The remainder of the taxes go to the State and other areas. If these ordinances pass, the money will only be used for roadway enhancements, including road lighting, new roads to alleviate traffic, grass cutting and landscaping. For every \$100 spent in an Economic Development District, the consumer will spend 75 cents. For every \$1000, it would be \$7.50. This is not a Parishwide tax. It is sales tax only and will only be used in these districts.

Toledano - moved to amend (read amendment into record), second by Lorino. Unanimous with no one absent.

Rabalais - the Parish does not have agreements with them.

Bellisario - moved to adopt, second by Groby. Unanimous with no one absent.

Dean - 19. Resolution C.S. No. C-4664 - Resolution to concur/ not concur with the City of Covington annexation of a parish right of way, which measures 1.66 acres, more or less, and is owned by St Tammany Parish Government, the right of way is identified as Regina Coeli Road, a parcel of land located in Sections 20, 29, & 45, Township 6 South, Range 11 East. (Ward 3, District 3) (Dean/Brister)

Thompson - moved to concur, second by Lorino. Unanimous with 1 absent (Binder).

APPEALS

Dean - 1. G. Beauregard Gelpi, Stephen and Crissy Green, Juliet Holton, et al. appealing the Zoning Commission APPROVAL on August 2, 2016 to rezone 1.98 acres located on the southwest corner of Highway 59 and Lonesome Road from NC-4 (Neighborhood Institutional District) to HC-2 (Highway Commercial District). (Ward 4, District 10) (2016-293-ZC) (Applicant: Jeffery Schoen on behalf of PTP Properties, LLC)

and adoption of a resolution.

Beau Gelpi - he represents the Homeowners' Associations for the surrounding subdivisions. They are all in opposition to this zoning change. They are not in opposition to the development of the land, they just think the development needs to be consistent with the commercial businesses on the other 3 corners, which are all low to no impact to the surrounding subdivisions, especially after dark. They do not want a gas station which will be open 24 hours and sell alcohol, which will present a major safety issue.

Jeff Schoen - he represents the property owners who are under contract to sell this corner to CST, a Fortune 500 company, who operate convenience stores. They think that the Zoning Commission did consider the issue carefully, and with a vote of 10-1 in favor, stated they felt this change was compatible. This company already owns the 25 acres which abut this property and is heavily wooded and obscures any view of residential areas. It is zoned Neighborhood Commercial, which would help the step down to residential absorbing any potential noise, etc. This intersection is already set aside for a roundabout to be built next year. The suggestion that a convenience store in and of itself is going to cause issues is not supported by any facts.

Tom Ballantine - spoke against the zoning change.

O'Brien - her district is not anti-anything, but they are pro-smart development. We want to the gateway to our Parish to be controlled. This corner is the gateway to this area. The other commercial businesses have little impact against the neighborhood. Because, as a Council member, they are charged with the health, safety, and wellness of this area, she moves to override.

Council Discussion ensued.

O'Brien - moved to override, second by Groby. Motion failed with 3 yeas (Thompson, Groby, O'Brien), 11 nays and no one absent.

Canulette - moved to concur, second by Bellisario. Motion passed with 12 yeas, 2 nays (Groby, O'Brien) and no one absent.

Canulette - moved to introduce, second by Bellisario; becomes Ord. Cal. No. 5678.

Dean - 2. Jay Lozes appealing the Zoning Commission APPROVAL on August 2, 2016 to rezone 1.199 acres located on Milne Circle, east of Alexander Drive and Highway 21 from MD-1 (Medical Residential District) to HC-2 (Highway Commercial District). (Ward 5, District 6) (2016-314-ZC) (Applicant: Frank Lamier)

and adoption of a resolution.

Jay Lozes - he lives diagonally across from Milne Developmental Services. He is in favor of their mission, but they want to change the zoning to be able to serve alcohol at receptions, etc. This is a residential neighborhood and does not meet the definition of commercial zoning. Allowing this to become commercial is spot zoning. They only have 18 parking spaces, so any remaining parking would be along neighborhood streets. He and the neighbors already hear the parties they have held. The company states they need to do this for financial gain, but they are supposed to be a non-profit agency. Their fear is that if this company fails at some point, then they would be stuck with commercial zoning, which could allow a 100 room hotel or a gas station.

Johanna April - President of Milne Developmental Services. At the Zoning Commission meeting, their attorney said that spot zoning was rare, but under certain circumstances can be approved. They want this rezoning, so that they can make some money to cover costs because the state only funds half to the costs for each client. They have 12 homes and some of the ladies do not cook, so the café is for staff and clients as well. They would like to convert the café into a seafood and steakhouse, which they were told would work better if they were able to serve alcohol. They do not plan on holding larger parties or wedding receptions. They did not know until tonight that any of their events had bothered their neighbors. They do not plan on going anywhere and want to be good neighbors.

Toledano - he thought Milne gave a great presentation from the Milne, but unfortunately, if there was ever a classic case of spot zoning, this is it and it is illegal. They are asking the Council to take a commercial endeavor and move it into a residential neighborhood. He does not feel this is inherently necessary for them to have this, and to approve this would set a terrible precedent.

Tanner - what Mr. Toledano said about this being illegal is just his opinion. He thinks everyone should visit this facility and see what they can do. This café is an activity that this facility needs, so family members can visit their relatives and have someplace to bring them to eat.

Council discussion ensued.

Tanner - moved to concur with the Approval, second by Thompson. Motion passed with 11 yeas, 3 nays (Dean, Toledano, O'Brien), and no one absent.

Tanner - moved to introduce, second by Thompson; becomes Ord. Cal. No. 5679.
